Program Refunds: Refund requests for weekly registrations will be granted in accordance with our normal refund policy. However, refunds for the "All 7 Weeks" will only be granted until June 19 which is the end of week 1.

Rain Policy:

Summer Blast will be held in light rain. In case of heavy rain, the program may be canceled. Call the Rec Commission office after 8:30 am on questionable days. If the program is canceled due to weather the following applies:

- 1 day of canceled program – no credit given
- 2-4 days canceled in one week – a West Shore Rec credit will be given in the appropriate amount that can be used toward any recreation program offered. No credit will be given to individuals who choose not to send their children when the location is open.
